



One of latest concept drawings. This one is for people with what would be considered unusable slopes in their back yards. You want a patio or entertainment area but the slope will not allow it. Wooden decks cannot support heavy structures plus they don't give the look and feel of hardscapes. This concept takes the soil cut out of the slope and uses GeoStone retaining walls to create a large level surface to put a patio, pool, outdoor fireplace, and/or outdoor kitchen. A majority of the fill material for this structure could potentially come from the slope which would significantly reduce the cost of this project. A great option for those who have unusable property due to sloping topography.



























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
